
Discussing Terrorism Issues: An Interview with Deb Kastner


What is the role of empathy and understanding in discussing terrorism issues?

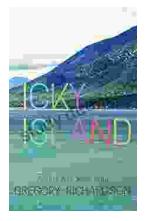
