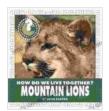
## How Do We Live Together? Mountain Lions and Community Connections

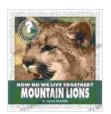

Living together with mountain lions is possible, but it requires a combination of education, outreach, research, and citizen science. By working together, we can create communities where both humans and mountain lions can thrive.

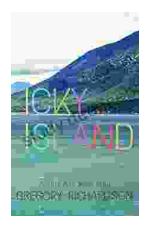


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
