



Moral

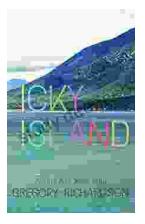
